She has made decent progress with both, working on details and we have focused on building technical resilience - the ability to keep going under pressure and remain consistent. Much of that is associated with trying to keep relaxed and connecting into the arms and shoulders. In addition, Aurelia has done well with the Gliere too, a piece she would have performed with a horn student in the London at Bryanston concert (postponed due to illness) - the intention is that this will be performed next term. In 2021, it would be good to explore some different composers too.
